Dear Mr. Goode:

This letter confirms that Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP (the *Firm*) will represent the Pampa Economic Development Corporation (the *Corporation*) as Bond Counsel, including any non-profit corporation now existing or hereafter created by the Corporation, in connection with the financing and development of projects in furtherance of its mission including the issuance of evidences of indebtedness or other incurrence of debt (together, *Debt*). Our acceptance of the Representation becomes effective upon the execution and return of the enclosed copy of this letter. The issuance or incurrence of Debt or the conduct of any elections are referred to herein as a "Matter"; our representation in connection with any Matter is referred to herein as the "Representation".

Terms of Engagement

This letter sets out the terms of our engagement in the Representation. Certain of those terms are included in the body of this letter, and additional terms are contained in the attached document, entitled *Additional Terms of Engagement*. That document is expressly incorporated into this letter, and it should be read carefully. The execution and return of the enclosed copy of this letter constitutes an unqualified agreement to all the terms set forth in this letter and in the attached *Additional Terms of Engagement*.

It is understood and agreed that our engagement is limited to the Representation. We are not being retained as general counsel, and our acceptance of this engagement does not imply any undertaking to provide legal services other than those set forth in this letter.

Our Personnel Who Will Be Working on the Matter

Stephanie Leibe and Matt Lee will be working on the Matter, along with assistance from appropriate attorneys and administrative staff from our Firm who are necessary to complete the applicable Representation with respect to a particular Matter. The Corporation may call, write, or e-mail us whenever it has questions about the Representation. Other personnel of our Firm, including lawyers and paralegals, will participate in the Representation if, in our judgement and with your concurrence, their participation is necessary or appropriate.

Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP is a limited liability partnership registered under the laws of Texas.

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Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP, Norton Rose Fulbright LLP, Norton Rose Fulbright Australia, Norton Rose Fulbright Canada LLP and Norton Rose Fulbright South Africa Inc are separate legal entities and all of them are members of Norton Rose Fulbright Verein, a Swiss verein. 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Our Legal Fees and Other Charges

Legal fees and costs are difficult to estimate. Except as discussed herein, accordingly, we have made no commitment concerning the maximum fees and charges that will be necessary to resolve or complete this representation.

From time to time, we may furnish estimates of legal fees and other charges that we anticipate will be incurred in connection with the Matter. Such estimates are by their nature inexact because of the potential of unforeseeable circumstances; and therefore, our actual fess and other charges may vary from such estimates.

Our fees will generally be based on the time spent by firm personnel, primarily firm lawyers or paralegals, who participate in the Representation and on the basis of the complexity of a Matter. For portions of the Representation that do not involve the issuance of Debt, we will agree with you to a fee arrangement that may be fixed fee or hourly in nature prior to our commencement of any work related to such portion of the Representation, such fees may be paid by the Corporate or by a third party (e.g. a counterparty to any development agreement entered into in connection with a project). For the portion of the Representation that involves the issuance of Debt, we will agree to a fixed fee the payment of which will be contingent on the delivery of the related series of Debt. Additional or special services, to include calling bond, special tax, or other matter elections, complex research, defense of audit, election contests, or debt-related litigation, shall be the subject of a separate fee arrangement, agreed upon by the Corporation and us, prior to the commencement to the Corporation's incurrence of any payment obligation with respect thereto.

In addition to our fees for rendering professional services, our statement will include other charges for expenses and services incurred incident to the performance of our legal services, such as transcript preparation, photocopying, delivery charges, travel expenses, overtime for secretaries and other nonlegal staff, Texas Attorney General filing fee (that we will pay on behalf of, subject to reimbursement by, the Corporation), specialized computer applications such as computerized legal research and filing fees. Our current recharge schedule (which is subject to change from time to time) is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Conflicts of Interest

Before accepting the Representation, we have undertaken reasonable and customary efforts to determine whether there are any potential conflicts of interest that would bar our firm from representing you in any Matter. Based on the information available to us, we are not aware of any potential disqualification. We reviewed that issue in accordance with the rules of professional responsibility adopted in Texas. We believe that those rules, rather than the rules of any other jurisdiction, are applicable to the Representation; and the execution and return of the enclosed copy of this letter by you represents an express agreement to the applicability of those rules.

You agree that we may represent current or future clients (including any parties adverse to you in this matter) in any other matter that is not substantially related to any Matter, even if their interests are directly adverse to you or your interests in that other. We agree however that we will not represent another client in a matter if we have obtained non-public proprietary or other confidential

information from you that could be used by that other client to your material disadvantage in that matter.

Conclusion

This letter and the attached *Additional Terms of Engagement* constitute the entire terms of the engagement of Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP in the Representation. These written terms of engagement are not subject to any oral agreements or understandings, and they can be modified only by further written agreement signed both by you and Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP. Unless expressly stated in these terms of engagement, no obligation or undertaking shall be implied on the part of either you or Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP.

Additional Terms of Engagement

This is a supplement to our engagement letter, dated January 5, 2021. The purpose of this document is to set out additional terms of our agreement to provide the representation described in our engagement letter (the "Representation") concerning the Pampa Economic Development Corporation (the "Corporation") debt issuances (the "Matter"). Because these additional terms of engagement are a part of our agreement to provide legal services, the Corporation should review them carefully and should promptly communicate to us any questions concerning this document. We suggest that the Corporation retain this statement of additional terms along with our engagement letter and any related documents.

The Scope of the Representation

As lawyers, we undertake to provide representation and advice on the legal matters for which we are engaged. It is important for our clients to have a clear understanding of the legal services that we have agreed to provide. Thus, if there are any questions about the scope of the Representation that we are to provide in the Matter, please raise those questions promptly, so that we may resolve them at the outset of the Representation.

Any expressions on our part concerning the outcome of the Representation, or any other legal matters, are based on our professional judgment and are not guarantees. Such expressions, even when described as opinions, are necessarily limited by our knowledge of the facts and are based on our views of the state of the law at the time they are expressed.

Upon accepting this engagement on the Corporation's behalf, Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP agrees to do the following: (1) provide legal counsel in accordance with these terms of engagement and the related engagement letter, and in reliance upon information and guidance provided by the Corporation; and (2) keep the Corporation reasonably informed about the status and progress of the Representation.

To enable us to provide effective representation, the Corporation agrees to do the following: (1) disclose to us, fully and accurately and on a timely basis, all facts and documents that are or might be material or that we may request, (2) keep us apprised on a timely basis of all developments relating to the Representation that are or might be material, (3) attend meetings, conferences, and other proceedings when it is reasonable to do so, and (4) otherwise cooperate fully with us.

Our firm has been engaged to provide legal services in connection with the Representation in the Matter, as specifically defined in our engagement letter. After completion of the Representation, changes may occur in the applicable laws or regulations that could affect the Corporation's future rights and liabilities in regard to the Matter. Unless we are actually engaged after the completion of the Representation to provide additional advice on such issues, the firm has no continuing obligation to give advice with respect to any future legal developments that may pertain to the Matter.

It is our policy and the Corporation's agreement that the person or entity that we represent is the one identified in our engagement letter, and that our attorney-client relationship does not include any related persons or entities. For example, if a corporation, partnership, or other organization is identified as our client in our engagement letter referenced above, we do not represent any

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related parent companies, subsidiaries, affiliates, employees, officers, directors, shareholders, partners, members, commonly owned corporations or partnerships, or other such persons, entities, or affiliates, whether becoming such by virtue of merger, dissolution, acquisition, or any other means. Accordingly, it is understood that we may represent another client with interests adverse to any such affiliated or related person or entity without first obtaining consent from the Corporation.

It is further agreed that the attorney-client relationship terminates upon our completion of the services for which we have been retained in the Representation.

Who Will Provide the Legal Services

As our engagement letter confirms, Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP will represent the in the Matter. Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP is a registered limited liability partnership under Chapter 152 of the Texas Business Organizations Code.

Although our firm will be providing legal services, each client of the firm customarily has a relationship principally with one attorney, or perhaps a few attorneys. At the same time, however, the work required in the Representation, or parts of it, may be performed by other firm personnel, including lawyers and paralegals. 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sentence shall not apply if, as a result of the Representation, we have obtained proprietary or other confidential information of a non-public nature that, if known to the other client, could be used in that matter by that client with the result of any material disadvantage to you.

In addition to our representation of other companies and individuals, we also regularly represent lawyers and law firms. As a result, opposing counsel in the Matter may be a lawyer or law firm that we may represent now or in the future. Likewise, opposing counsel in the Matter may represent our firm now or in the future. Further, we have professional and personal relationships with many other attorneys, often because of our participation in bar associations and other professional organizations. It is our professional judgment that such relationships with other attorneys do not adversely affect our ability to represent any client. If the Matter involves transactions, litigation or administrative proceedings or like proceedings in which we appear as counsel of record for the Corporation in publicly available records, we reserve the right to inform others of the fact of our representation of the Corporation in the Matter and (if likewise reflected of record in publicly available records) the results obtained, unless the Corporation specifically directs otherwise.

Further, in the event of termination of the Representation, the Corporation will take all steps necessary to release Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP of any further obligations in the Representation or the Matter, including without limitation the execution of any documents necessary to effectuate our withdrawal from the Representation or the Matter.

Billing Arrangements and Terms of Payment

Our engagement letter specifically explains our fees for services in the Matter. We will bill on a regular basis, normally each month, for fees and expenses and charges. It is agreed that the Corporation will make full payment within 30 days of receiving our statement. We will give notice if an account becomes delinquent, and it is further agreed that any delinquent account must be paid upon the giving of such notice. If the delinquency continues and the Corporation does not arrange satisfactory payment terms, we may withdraw from the Representation and pursue collection of our account.

Document Retention

At the close of any matter, we send our files in that matter to a storage facility for storage at our expense. The attorney closing the file determines how long we will maintain the files in storage. After that time, we will destroy the documents in the stored files.

At the conclusion of the Representation, we return to the client any documents that are specifically requested to be returned. As to any documents so returned, we may elect to keep a copy of the documents in our stored files.

Charges for Other Expenses and Services

Typically, our invoices will include amounts, not only for legal services rendered, but also for other expenses and services. Examples include charges for photocopying, travel and conference expenses, messenger deliveries, Texas Attorney General filing fee, UCC filing, TEFRA notices, telephone conferences, and computerized research. In addition, we reserve the right to send to the Corporation for direct payment any invoices delivered to us by others, including experts and any vendors.

In situations where we can readily determine the exact amount of expenses for products and services provided by third parties to be charged to your account, our invoices will reflect the cost to us of the products and services. In many situations, however, the precise total cost of providing

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a product or service is difficult to establish, in which case we will use our professional judgment on the charges to be made for such product or service, which charges may vary from or exceed our direct cost of such product or service. In some situations, we can arrange for ancillary services to be provided by third parties with direct billing to the client. Attached is a copy of our current recharge schedule for expenses and services, which is subject to change from time to time.

Standards of Professionalism and Attorney Complaint Information

I will be loyal and committed to my client's lawful objectives, but I will not permit that loyalty and commitment to interfere with my duty to provide objective and independent advice. I will advise my client that civility and courtesy are expected and are not a sign of weakness. I will advise my client of proper and expected behavior. I will treat adverse parties and witnesses with fairness and due consideration. A client has no right to demand that I abuse anyone or indulge in any offensive conduct. I will advise my client that we will not pursue conduct which is intended primarily to harass or drain the financial resources of the opposing party. I will advise my client that we will not pursue tactics which are intended primarily for delay. I will advise my client that we will not pursue any course of action which is without merit. I will advise my client that I reserve the right to determine whether to grant accommodations to opposing counsel in all matters that do not adversely affect my client's lawful objectives. A client has no right to instruct me to refuse reasonable requests made by other counsel. I will advise my client regarding the availability of mediation, arbitration, and other alternative methods of resolving and settling disputes.
- III. LAWYER TO LAWYER. A lawyer owes to opposing counsel, in the conduct of legal transactions and the pursuit of litigation, courtesy, candor, cooperation, and scrupulous observance of all agreements and mutual understandings. III feelings between clients shall not influence a lawyer's conduct, attitude, or demeanor toward opposing counsel. A lawyer shall not engage in unprofessional conduct in retaliation against other unprofessional conduct. I will be courteous, civil, and prompt in oral and written communications. I will not guarrel over matters of form or style, but I will concentrate on matters of substance. I will identify for other counsel or parties all changes I have made in documents submitted for review. I will attempt to prepare documents which correctly reflect the agreement of the parties. I will not include provisions which have not been agreed upon or omit provisions which are necessary to reflect the agreement of the parties. I will notify opposing counsel, and, if appropriate, the Court or other persons, as soon as practicable.

when hearings, depositions, meetings, conferences or closings are canceled. I will agree to reasonable requests for extensions of time and for waiver of procedural formalities, provided legitimate objectives of my client will not be adversely affected. I will not serve motions or pleadings in any manner that unfairly limits another party's opportunity to respond. I will attempt to resolve by agreement my objections to matters contained in pleadings and discovery requests and responses. I can disagree without being disagreeable. I recognize that effective representation does not require antagonistic or obnoxious behavior. I will neither encourage nor knowingly permit my client or anyone under my control to do anything which would be unethical or improper if done by me. I will not, without good cause, attribute bad motives or unethical conduct to opposing counsel nor bring the profession into disrepute by unfounded accusations of impropriety. I will avoid disparaging personal remarks or acrimony towards opposing counsel, parties and witnesses. I will not be influenced by any ill feeling between clients. I will abstain from any allusion to personal peculiarities or idiosyncrasies of opposing counsel. I will not take advantage, by causing any default or dismissal to be rendered, when I know the identity of an opposing counsel, without first inquiring about that counsel's intention to proceed. I will promptly submit orders to the Court. I will deliver copies to opposing counsel before or contemporaneously with submission to the court. I will promptly approve the form of orders which accurately reflect the substance of the rulings of the Court. I will not attempt to gain an unfair advantage by sending the Court or its staff correspondence or copies of correspondence. I will not arbitrarily schedule a deposition, Court appearance, or hearing until a good faith effort has been made to schedule it by agreement. I will readily stipulate to undisputed facts in order to avoid needless costs or inconvenience for any party. I will refrain from excessive and abusive discovery. I will comply with all reasonable discovery requests. I will not resist discovery requests which are not objectionable. I will not make objections nor give instructions to a witness for the purpose of delaying or obstructing the discovery process. I will encourage witnesses to respond to all deposition questions which are reasonably understandable. I will neither encourage nor permit my witness to quibble about words where their meaning is reasonably clear. I will not seek Court intervention to obtain discovery which is clearly improper and not discoverable. I will not seek sanctions or disqualification unless it is necessary for protection of my client's lawful objectives or is fully justified by the circumstances.

IV. LAWYER AND JUDGE. Lawyers and judges owe each other respect, diligence, candor, punctuality, and protection against unjust and improper criticism and attack. Lawyers and judges are equally responsible to protect the dignity and independence of the Court and the profession. I will always recognize that the position of judge is the symbol of both the judicial system and administration of justice. I will refrain from conduct that degrades this symbol. I will conduct myself in court in a professional manner and demonstrate my respect for the Court and the law. I will treat counsel, opposing parties, the Court, and members of the Court staff with courtesy and civility. I will be punctual. I will not engage in any conduct which offends the dignity and decorum of proceedings. I will not knowingly misrepresent, mischaracterize, misquote or miscite facts or authorities to gain an advantage. I will respect the rulings of the Court. I will give the issues in controversy deliberate, impartial and studied analysis and consideration. I will be considerate of the time constraints and pressures imposed upon the Court, Court staff and counsel in efforts to administer justice and resolve disputes.

RESOLUTION NO. R21-002

RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF PAMPA, TEXAS ("CITY") APPROVING THE SURCHARGE RELATED TO DOCKET NO. 49831 SUBMITTED BY SOUTHWESTERN PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY ON ABOUT DECEMBER 18, 2020; AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN A COALITION OF SIMILARLY SITUATED CITIES KNOWN AS THE ALLIANCE OF XCEL MUNICIPALITIES; AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN RELATED RATE PROCEEDINGS; REQUIRING THE REIMBURSEMENT OF MUNICIPAL RATE CASE EXPENSES; AUTHORIZING THE RETENTION OF SPECIAL COUNSEL; FINDING THAT THE MEETING COMPLIES WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT; AND MAKING OTHER FINDINGS AND PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE SUBJECT

WHEREAS, on about December 18, 2020, Southwestern Public Service Company, LLC ("SPS") filed an application for authority to implement a surcharge in the amount of about \$71.5 million related to the rates agreed to and approved by the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("PUCT") in Docket No. 49831 (SPS's 2019 general rate case); and

WHEREAS, SPS's application to approve a surcharge is in accord with the agreement the parties, including the Alliance of Xcel Municipalities ("AXM"), reached in Docket No. 46936 (SPS's 2017 "Wind-Farm Case") in which the PUCT approved SPS's request to allow it to construct and operate the Hale and Sagamore wind facilities; and

WHEREAS, in the Wind-Farm Case the parties agreed that in SPS's then-next general rate case, SPS could seek to implement the rates finally approved in that general rate case such that those rates would relate back to the 35th day after it filed its general rate case; and

WHEREAS, that general rate case is Docket No. 49831, SPS's 2019 rate case, and the 35th day after filing in Docket No. 49831, is September 12, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the rates the PUCT ultimately approved in Docket No. 49831 have an effective date of August 31, 2020, thus making the period over which the surcharge is calculated, the period from September 12, 2019 through August 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, SPS proposes to implement the surcharge over a one-year period from April 1, 2021 through March 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, AXM's Special Counsel and rate experts engaged on behalf of AXM have reviewed SPS's application to implement an surcharge and have confirmed that SPS

correctly calculated the surcharge and that its method for implementing the surcharge is mathematically correct and consistent with AXM's prior agreement with SPS; and

WHEREAS, the City is a regulatory authority under the Public Utility Regulatory Act ("PURA") and under Chapter 33, §33.001 et seq. of PURA has exclusive original jurisdiction over SPS's rates, operations, and services within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, in order to maximize the efficient use of resources and expertise in reviewing SPS's request it is prudent to coordinate the City's efforts with a coalition of similarly situated municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the City, in matters regarding SPS's rates, services, and operations has in the past joined with other local regulatory authorities in the Alliance of Xcel Municipalities ("AXM") of cities and hereby continues its participation in AXM; and

WHEREAS, SPS simultaneously filed its application to implement a surcharge with the Public Utility Commission of Texas, and therefore the decision of the Public Utility Commission of Texas could affect SPS's proposed surcharge, and thus impact the rates charged within the City, and in order for the City's participation to be meaningful it is important that the City promptly intervene in such proceeding at the Public Utility Commission of Texas.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAMPA, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1. The findings set out in the preamble are in all things approved and incorporated herein as if fully set forth.

SECTION 2. The City **APPROVES** SPS's application filed on about December 18, 2020, to implement a net surcharge in the amount not to exceed \$71,546,546, including interest in the amount of \$1,604,142, and directs SPS to refund to ratepayers any over-recovery that may occur above the \$71,546,546.

SECTION 3. The City authorizes intervention in proceedings related to SPS's application before the Public Utility Commission of Texas and related proceedings in courts of law as part of the coalition of cities known as the Alliance of Xcel Municipalities.

SECTION 4. The City hereby directs SPS to reimburse the City's rate case expenses, as part of the Alliance of Xcel Municipalities, and that it do so on a monthly basis and within 30 days

after submission of the City's invoices related to proceedings involving SPS before the City, the Public Utility Commission of Texas, or any court of law.

SECTION 5. Subject to the right to terminate employment at any time, the City retains and authorizes the law firm of Herrera Law & Associates, PLLC to act as Special Counsel with regard to rate proceedings involving SPS before the City, the Public Utility Commission of Texas, or any court of law and to retain such experts as may be reasonably necessary for review of SPS's surcharge application subject to approval by the City.

SECTION 6. The City, through its participation in the Alliance of Xcel Municipalities, shall review the invoices of the lawyers and rate experts for reasonableness before submitting the invoices to SPS for reimbursement.

SECTION 7. A copy of this resolution shall be sent to SPS's local representative and to Mr. Alfred R. Herrera, Herrera Law & Associates, PLLC, 4524 Burnet Road, Austin, Texas 78756.

SECTION 8. The meeting at which this resolution was approved was in all things conducted in compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

SECTION 9. This resolution shall become effective from and after its passage.

BACKGROUND

On December 18, 2020, Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS") filed an application with the City and the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission" or "PUC") for approval to implement a net surcharge arising from its most recent base-rate case, Docket No. 49831. The amount of SPS's proposed surcharge is \$71 million and is to be implemented over a one-year period from April 1, 2021 through March 31, 2022.

SPS's application to approve a surcharge is in accord with the agreement the parties, including the Alliance of Xcel Municipalities ("AXM"), reached in Docket No. 46936 (the "Wind-Farm Case"). The Wind-Farm Case is the proceeding filed in 2017 where the PUC approved SPS's request to allow it to construct and operate the Hale and Sagamore wind facilities. In the Wind-Farm Case the parties agreed that in SPS's then-next general rate case, SPS could seek to implement the rates finally approved in that general rate case such that those rates would relate back to the 35th day after it filed its general rate case. That general rate case is Docket No. 49831, SPS's 2019 rate case.

In Docket No. 49831, the 35th day after filing is September 12, 2019. Docket No. 49831 was a settled case and as part of the settlement, the parties agreed to an increase in SPS's base-rate revenue of \$88 million. The rates the PUC ultimately approved in Docket No. 49831 have an effective date of August 31, 2020.

On August 31, 2020, SPS began implementing the rates resulting from the PUC's final order approving the settlement in Docket No. 49831. Thus, pursuant to the parties' agreement, the surcharge period is the period from September 12, 2019 through August 31, 2020. The proposed surcharge allows SPS to recover revenues that it would have recovered if the rates approved in Docket No. 49831 had been in effect from September 12, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

AMOUT OF SURCHARGE PER CUSTOMER CLASS

SPS proposes that each customer class pay its share of the total \$71 million surcharge as indicated in the table below. Note that while the surcharge in a net increase to rates, some customer classes will receive a rate decrease.

The average usage by for the Residential customer is about 1,000 kWh; the surcharge for a customer using 1,000 kWh per month is about \$12.85 per month, which equates to an increase of about 11.56% in the customer's bill.

REPRESENTATION

The law firm of Herrera Law & Associates, PLLC (through Mr. Alfred R. Herrera) has previously represented the Alliance of Xcel Municipalities ("AXM") in rate matters involving SPS, including the recent cases, SPS's Wind-Farm Case and SPS's 2019 general rate case.

REVIEW OF SURCHARGE APPLICATION

RATE CASE EXPENSES

In ratemaking proceedings, including SPS's application for approval of a surcharge, Cities, by statute, are entitled to recover their reasonable rate case expenses from the utility. Thus, AXM's rate-case expenses are reimbursable from SPS, who in turn recovers those rate case expenses from ratepayers. Legal counsel and consultants approved by the City submit monthly invoices to the City of Amarillo, and the City of Amarillo in turn makes those invoices available for review by any AXM city and forwards the invoice to SPS for reimbursement.

INTERVENTION AT THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION OF TEXAS AND COURT PROCEEDINGS, IF ANY

SPS filed its request for approval of a net surcharge related to Docket No. 49831 with the City on the same date it filed its application with the PUC. It is important to participate in the PUC's proceeding because its final decision may affect SPS's proposed surcharge. Thus, the accompanying Resolution authorizes intervention in proceedings at the PUC, including any appeal of the City's decision on rates.

RECOMMENDATION

AXM's Special Counsel recommends that the City:

- 1. Approve SPS's proposed surcharge related to Docket No. 49831 by no later than the end of February 2021;
- 2. Intervene in the proceeding at the PUC, and related appeals, if any; and
- 3. Direct SPS to reimburse AXM's rate-case expenses on a monthly basis.

It is also recommended that the City continue its participation in AXM and that the City, through AXM, retain the law firm of Herrera Law & Associates, PLLC to represent the City's interest in matters related to SPS's surcharge application and to advise the City with regard to SPS's application.

WHEREAS, Summer Village, L.P., has advised the City of Pampa that it intends to submit an application for affordable rental housing to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) for 2021 Competitive 9% Housing Tax Credits within Region #1, Rural Category, in the City of Pampa, Gray County, Texas; and,

WHEREAS, Summer Village, L.P., has proposed a development for a new affordable multi-family housing development at the northwest corner of N. Sumner St. and W. Somerville St., named Summer Village in the City of Pampa, Gray County, Texas; and,

WHEREAS, there is a TDHCA scoring item that requires a de-minims commitment of development funding by the local political subdivision (City of Pampa) which confirms the City of Pampa will provide streamlined site plan and permit review which is valued at least in the amount of \$500 for the development;

A sample LURA can be provided upon request. The community will include a range of amenities for the residents including a leasing office with on-site property management, community room and warming kitchen, library, fitness center, computer room, and more. Social services will be provided for the residents such as notary services, exercise classes, a food pantry, art and recreation classes, weekly home chore services, and resident social programming among other services to be overseen by Fairway Management.

We are seeking a Letter of Support from the Pampa City Council for this development as part of our 2021 application process. We are also asking for a \$250 contribution to the project in the form of a fee waiver. Please let us know if there are any questions that we can address.
